

ORDINANCE NO. 14-07

**ORDINANCE AMENDING KLAMATH FALLS CODE SECTIONS
BY REPEALING COUNCIL MEETING PROCEDURES AND SECTIONS
2.150 AND 2.155 REPEALING ELECTION ORDINANCES**

WHEREAS, the City desires to repeal City Code Sections 2.150 and 2.155 because state law conflicts with these sections and the City's practice is to follow state law; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to repeal the City Code Sections relating to Council meeting procedures and transferring the procedures to City Council rules that are adopted by Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to enact a City Code Section authorizing the City to establish procedures for City Council meetings by Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to update City Code Section 2.045 to require that persons interrupting a City Council meeting shall be removed; and **NOW THEREFORE**,

THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

City Council shall establish by Resolution procedures for Council Meetings. Such procedures shall establish the schedule of the regular Council meetings, the types of Council meetings, the order of business, consent agenda items, the duties and privileges of City Council, the duties of the Council Chair, employee duties, and the public code of conduct.

Ordinance is provided for each Council member and 3 written copies are provided for public inspection in the Council Chambers at the time of its consideration. An Ordinance enacted after being read by title alone may have no legal effect if it differs substantially from its terms as it was written, unless each section incorporating such a difference is read fully and distinctly in open Council meeting as finally amended prior to being approved by the Council.

- (3) Upon the final vote on an Ordinance, the ayes and nays of the Council members shall be taken and entered in the record of proceedings. Except as provided in the City Charter regarding ward boundaries (Section 8), overriding vetoes (Section 18 and 34) and election procedures (Section 30), when 4 affirmative votes are required, the affirmative vote of 3 members of the Council present at the Council meeting shall be necessary to pass the Ordinance.
- (4) Upon enactment of an Ordinance, the Recorder shall sign it with the date of its passage, and within 3 days the Mayor shall sign it, veto it or set it aside pursuant to Charter Section 34.

2.087 RESOLUTIONS

- (1) Every Resolution shall, before being passed, be read in open Council meeting. The reading of a Resolution may be by title only if no Council member present at the meeting requests that the Resolution be read in full, provided that a written copy of the Resolution is provided for each Council member and 3 written copies are provided for public inspection in the Council Chambers at the time of its consideration.
- (2) Upon final vote on a Resolution, the ayes and nays of the Council members shall be taken and entered in the record of proceedings.
- (3) Upon enactment of a Resolution, the Recorder shall sign it with the date of its passage and within 3 days, the Mayor shall sign it. The Mayor shall have no power to veto a Resolution.
- (4) A Resolution enacted by the Council shall take effect immediately.



ORDINANCE NO. 06-24

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2.020(2)
OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS
RELATING TO THE CONSENT AGENDA AND
DECLARING A LEGISLATIVE EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Section 2.020(2) of the City Code allows any Council or staff member to remove one or more Consent Agenda items for the purpose of considering such items individually during the regular agenda; and

WHEREAS, when an item has been removed from the Consent Agenda, Section 2.020(2) of the Code requires that such item be considered at the end of the Legislative Agenda; and

WHEREAS, Council has observed that often times items are removed from the Consent Agenda simply to clarify a small point or to get increased public exposure and awareness of the action being taken and that it can sometimes be a great imposition on members of the public who have an interest in the items and who may be required to wait several hours for the Legislative Agenda to be concluded; and

WHEREAS, Council has asked staff to present a proposed amendment to City Code Section 2.020(2) requiring that "removed" Consent Agenda items be considered immediately following the Consent Agenda; NOW, THEREFORE,

THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1

Section 2.020(2) of the Code of the City of Klamath Falls is hereby amended as follows [new language in *bold italics* and old deleted language is in ~~strikethrough font~~]:

2.020 Consent Agenda.

* * *

(2) The Consent Agenda shall be subject to one combined vote of Council; provided, however, prior to such vote any member of the public through written request, any Council member or any staff member, may request to have removed one or more Consent Agenda items to be considered individually during the regular agenda. Such items shall be considered ~~at the end of Legislative Action~~ *immediately following Council action on the Consent Agenda.*

Section 2

It being necessary for the preservation of public peace, health, safety and welfare that this Ordinance be enacted immediately, a legislative emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force on the date of its passage by the City Council and approval by the Mayor.
