City Manager

Air Service- As you will see on the calendar, PenAir will be in town on July 21 hosting an open house at the Airport Terminal. This is open to the general public with a desire to excite people about using their service. You can book flights to Portland directly on PenAir’s website www.penair.com/. As of Thursday, we are still waiting for Alaska Air to add Crater Lake Klamath Regional Airport onto its schedule.

Air Guard – The City played host to the Commander of Air Education and Training this past week. Lt. General Roberson visited Kingsley field, one of 30 bases, that perform an Air Education and Training Function. Our relationship with Kingsley Field staff was highlighted as a positive. One concern we will need to address as a community is a lack

of rental housing. We are currently working on the proposed housing with Tokola properties, but the lack of quality rentals is a concern.

Police

BINET detectives completed a drug trafficking investigation in Klamath Falls. Two men were arrested and charged with distribution of significant quantities of methamphetamine into our community. The story was carried in the Herald and News, I have provided a link below.

Wellness - The police department implemented a Wellness Program to increase physical, mental, and emotional health of the employees. The goals of the Wellness Program include the reduction of injury claims, reduction of costs associated with injuries, reduction of sick time usage, increased health and fitness of staff and increased service delivery to our community.

Public Works

Development Services:

- Construction is complete on Sugarman's Corner and a ribbon cutting ceremony was held on June 30th. Artwork will continue to be added to the park in the coming months. The City and the Downtown Association are working with the Ross Ragland Theatre to program events within the park.

- Construction is underway on Phase 1 of the Pelican City Booster Waterline interconnect between Nevada Street and the hospital area. Phase 1 consists of approximately 3600 lineal feet of new water main between Nevada Street and Alma Alley. Citizens should expect periodic traffic delays when traveling along Montelius Street.
- Construction is underway on the Melrose Street and Haskins Alley waterline replacement project. This work is located along Melrose between Pacific Terrace and Newcastle Avenue, and along Haskins Alley between Portland Street and Earle Street. Citizens should expect periodic traffic delays when traveling in the area.
- Construction is underway on a sidewalk and handrail rehabilitation project along Main Street through the railway underpass between East Main Street and Spring Street. Motorists should take caution when traveling through the area to avoid construction activity and pedestrians traveling along alternative routes.

Streets- Crews will be performing work during the hours of 6:00am to 4:30 pm (weather permitting) on July 11, through July 15, 2016 as follows:

- Stewart Lennox Sub Division, Crack Seal, Chip Seal Preparations - Monday July 11 through Thursday July 14 Asphalt crews will be digging out sections and repaving in several within the Stewart Lennox Subdivision.
- Paint Crews will begin Main Line Striping, CITY WIDE, with assistance from Klamath County Striping crews. Tuesday July 12 through Thursday July 14, 2016. There will be many different lane closures, Crews will be directing vehicles away and off of freshly painted lines please follow Traffic control to avoid Crews and WET paint.
